

2020 Summer/Fall Best Planting dates for Central Texas
Tim Miller - Milberg Farm

July

- 2,3 Transplants arugula, peppers, eggplant give shade, seeds of melons, squashes, cucumbers, and beans
- 6, 7 Radishes since soil is wet
- 10th Fig trees into the ground
- 21,29,30 Seeds of leaf crops, melons, squashes, pole lima beans

August

- 6,7,8 Multiplying onion bulbs sprout in 4 inch pots for early fall
- 17 Bush or pole beans
- 25, 26 Leaf crops tomato seeds into flats, transplant in peppers
- 30, 31 Radish, beets, and potatoes if we still have wet soil

September

- 3,4,5 Transplants of squashes, peppers, cabbage, and broccoli
- 9,10 Root crops beets and carrots
- 22 Leaf crops: seed in broccoli, cabbage, chard, kale *, Silvery Fir Tree tomatoes into flats*
- 27 Root crops: carrots, beets, radish, and turnips

October

- 1,2 Transplant in broccoli, cabbage, kale, and chard
- 5,6,7 Root crops
- 11 Snow, sugar, and snap peas
- 19,20 Leaf crops seeded in
- 29 Transplant in tomatoes into 4 inch or gallon, broccoli, cabbage, cauliflower

November

- 2,3,4 Root crops: beets into hoop house, turnips, carrots, radishes
- 15,16,17 Leaf crops: lettuce, chard, arugula, broccoli, and spinach
- 23,24,25 Leaf crops: lettuce, collards, spinach, broccoli
- 29 Root crops: carrots, beets

December

- 1 Root crops: carrots, beets
- 4 Snow or sugar peas
- 13,14 Snow or sugar peas
- 21,22,23 Leaf crops: seed in lettuce and spinach
- 27 Transplant in all available greens
- 28 Root crops: beets, carrots
